

From the desk of Father William

The basic motive of today's readings is our being called by God. If there is one thing that the Scriptures impress on us it is that if we wait for God's call to come to us in unmistakable clarity that will once and for all dispel all doubt and ambiguity, then we may have to wait along time. In fact, we may never hear him call us.

But call us God does. The point is he does it in a very subtle way, in an inconspicuous way, in a very ordinary way. That can be no less unsettling. God calls us in the midst of routine reality. Notice the very first words we hear Jesus

speak in today's Gospel: "What are you looking for?" I would like to think that Jesus addresses that question to us as well: What do we seek in Jesus. This listening to God's calling us is described in the Scriptures as following Jesus. It is really staying with Jesus, an abiding with Jesus, and giving ourselves over to Jesus whom we profess as our Lord, as the Messiah.

My dear friends, it is this interaction between a God who calls, and us who respond by following Jesus, which makes us into Church. Church is not for us a building or an institution, but a community of people who know themselves called by God and who are prepared to stand by each other in responding to that call. God calls us today. We must also be prepared to let ourselves be won over by God's grace, for it is God's pledge that with his power at work in us, we can perform deeds that we never thought ourselves capable of. It is all part of the fact that in God's eyes we are, despite our weakness and insignificance, the stuff of which God's kingdom is built. We have got all it takes to build the city of God. Perhaps you too had a surprising, forgiving, and overwhelming experience of the love of God. That encounter of grace will enable you to rise above doubt, fear and your own sinfulness.

Jesus walks into our lives today and asks, "What are you looking for?" What is our answer? Do we want religion as usual, something comforting and unchanging and unchallenging? Or do we want to know, as the disciples did, where Jesus is headed? To their question, Jesus replies only: "Come, and you will see." Come—don't just stand there, don't expect things to stay the same. If we want to see where Jesus is headed, we have to follow where he is going. "Our God is a 'walking' God," as the old spiritual reminds us. Discipleship demands that we are willing to move out of our complacency and familiar comforts and ask new questions of ourselves. It will necessarily mean change and sacrifice. Our time of decision, we see, has wheels.

On this World Day of Migrants and Refugees let us pray for refuges everywhere longing for safe passage and a place to call home. Pray also for the safe arrival of our families soon.
