
Mission Statement

From the desk of Father William

This week is holy because of love, but it is love misunderstood. At the beginning of Holy Week, we have the panoramic view of the Passion and death of Jesus presented to us in Mark's gospel with all its drama and intrigue and details. We are placed by it into the very center of the events as they are happening. Listen to the different stories. Let them change your life. The entire range of human emotions come into play in the readings today, evoking connections with those of us who have experienced loss, failure,

misunderstanding, injustice, illness, temptation, abandonment, and betrayal, as well as courage in the face of danger and faithfulness in the face of even death.

They are everywhere in the familiar account of the Passion. People whose names we don't know but who play their part in the greatest story ever told. There are the major figures too: Peter and Judas, Caiaphas and Pilate, Simon the Cyrene and Barabbas the criminal, the Mary's at the cross and tomb, as well as Joseph of Arimathea. So - where do you fit into the story of teachings and crucifixion? Where would you like to fit in? What will you do about it? Jesus is always singling you out, and his relationship with you is unique and deep. You are someone whom he has taught, healed, forgiven, touched, and been touched by. Walk the whole walk with him this week. Keep your eyes locked on his as he reveals again the depth of his passion for you.

So how are we to enter this holy week? My friends, may I suggest that we enter the Passion of Jesus in a way that will move us toward genuine conversion and transformation. Let us recognize our own strengths or limitations in the characters of the story and note how Jesus calls them to greater fidelity. Or let us identify with Jesus. He willingly set aside privilege for the sake of others; he remained true to his calling, despite the cost that was exacted; he refused to meet violence with violence. Through it all, Jesus remained tenaciously faithful to God and lovingly open to all others.

That is our challenge as well to remain tenaciously faithful to God and lovingly open to all others. The conditions of our world may make us feel that this is a terrible week, not a holy one. But we can change this, if only in some small way. We will make it holy if we can begin to realize the depth of God's magnanimous love. We will make it holy if we can bring unconditional love into the lives of those around us. We will make it holy if we live according to the forgiving and healing standards of Jesus who, though disgraced, is still our hero. Learning to trust and love —that is the great thing.
