

SUNDAY May 28th, 2017 Ascension of the Lord

<u>From Fr. William's Desk</u>

Today, when we celebrate the Ascension of Christ, we are not celebrating something in addition to his Resurrection. Rather, it is an aspect of the Resurrection. It is still very much Easter. When we hear that Jesus ascended into heaven and that he is seated at the right hand of the father, we may ask, what does that mean for us? Much depends on how we understand it.




There is danger in the way the Ascension of

Jesus into heaven is sometimes portrayed. It has **fatherwilliam@shaw.ca** nothing to do with Jesus being in some way the first astronaut. It is better to leave everything we know today about space travel and all the spatial images, because all of that is more than a hindrance than help. Nor is the Ascension of Jesus to be understood as some sort of farewell, a leave taking, as if he is now safely protected from all we have to contend with. At least I cannot find much inspiration and encouragement, if we supposedly have to believe in a Jesus who lives in a totally different and more secure environment.

Today's celebration is the ritual marker of the shift in the way the Disciples of Christ have experienced his risen presence. But the readings look resolutely forward, not back as if to a golden age now lost. In Acts, the disciples are prodded by angelic visitors to get to work: "Why do you stand looking up toward heaven?" In the Letter to the Ephesians Paul describes the power available to disciples as the same as that which raised Jesus from the dead: "may you know the hope to which he has called you. And in the Gospel of Matthew we hear Jesus give to the Eleven the "Great Commission": "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations ... baptize ... teach."

Yes, indeed, today's scripture readings send us in another direction. ^{Ass} Witnesses to Jesus in what way? By talking about him? That will not be of much use to anyone, if it remains limited to that. **From now on, it is by means of our lives, by means of our discipleship that we give concrete evidence of the fact that Jesus is not absent from our world, but still very much present in our world**. Without that, the significance of the story of Jesus threatens to be reduced to once upon a time story: beautiful, very moving even, but we remain at a safe distance from it. When Jesus shares with us the Spirit that encouraged him, it means that he takes us into a partnership with him on the building of his life project, God's kingdom.
