SUNDAY - May 5, 2024 Sixth Sunday of Easter

Easter continues to invite us into God's amazing, immeasurable love, abundant joy, and the sacred intimacy of abiding with the Father and the Son. God's love is constant and when we live in God's love, God's joy sings forth from our hearts. We are friends of God because we know God's story; we are invited into the intimate relationship of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The world creates this hierarchical standard of who's in and who's out, who's deserving of accolades, who's good enough, and who measures up. Isn't it wonderful to know that God's love does not depend on our initiative or on our worthiness? We don't have to reach out to God or even believe in God in order to be loved by God. God showers love on us whether we deserve it or not! So this Easter, are we on the world's hamster wheel or are we walking in the light of the resurrection?

God's love is not passive. God actively gifts us Jesus; God forgives and redeems; God gives us the Holy Spirit to actively engage us; God transforms us; God gives us eternal life. God's love motivates us to be active in the world, so how do we take initiative with our love this day?

We are Easter people. We are all called to be God's beloved overflowing with God's love for all. As Easter people, we desire to give our best, so God commands us to love one another as God has loved us. There is no judgement, no conditions, no favoritism, no prejudices – we are called to lay down our very life for others. If there isn't real love for God's people in our life, then our claim to know God and experience God isn't true. If we want to love one another more, we must draw closer to God and ask God to help us be more Christ-like.

Abiding is such a beautiful word. Common synonyms are bear, endure, stand, suffer, and tolerate. While all these words mean 'to put up with something trying or painful,' abide suggests acceptance without resistance or protest. Who does that sound like? The Greek roots of the word means to dwell, remain, be present, and to be held and kept. This is Jesus' relationship with His Father. It sounds like home to me, a place to rest in the presence of God, remain in God's Word, and inhale the fruits of God's love in order to go forth renewed and transformed.

Let us immerse ourselves more deeply into a heart and soul relationship with God. Only then will we attune our will to the will of God. God chooses and empowers you...me...to fulfill God's will wherever we are. Do I entrust myself to God? Do I rest in a God who loves me and wants me to live in joy, love, and peace here now and in eternity? Live deeply in God's love and radiate that love to the whole world, bearing much fruit!

Planet Positive Tips

Effective water use in the garden

- Add organic matter to your soil (compost, manure or peat moss) to hold more moisture.
- Add mulch on top of soil to retain water
- Water early in the morning or late at night.
- Deliver water to the root zone.
- Use drip irrigation for slow and effective watering.

Word of the Week: Numerology

The biblical idea, common in the ancient world, was that numbers hold mystical significance. The clue to interpreting the hidden meaning of a text was often in appreciating the numbers associated with it. Significant numbers often recur in the Bible. Knowing that the number three stands for completeness, four for totality, seven for the divine realm, 12 for the whole people helps us understand the biblical narratives in which they appear. From *The Collegeville Pastoral Dictionary of Biblical Theology*: In its use of numbers the Bible often attaches a symbolic value that demands an understanding on the part of the interpreter of the connotation of numbers. The Bible is not an exact timetable that predicts the precise occurrence of future events.
