
Vision Statement

From Fr. William's Desk

The point of today's parable is that we take good notice of what each one of us has been graced with by God. What I am referring to is our ability to love our ability to give life to the persons around us. We have all been equally graced with that sort of talent. With that ability to love that has been freely given to us, we are summoned to make our own contribution, in word and deed, to the growth and realization of God's kingdom on earth. I cannot think of a greater investment by God in us than that one.

This story is about the end, and about the account to be rendered in the end. What today's parable suggests is that we make full use of that one God-given

talent that we have all received. But then making full use of it, not out of fear for the eventual account we have to give of it, not out of fear of a punishing God who will take no nonsense in the end. That sort of fear paralyzes you. What a tragic, depressing figure, that third servant! Did you notice how the third servant responds to God? "I hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours; you have it back." He sees himself on contract with God; not in partnership with God. The two other servants, on the other hand, had a sense of the immense faith that God showed in them. They were thrilled by God's inviting them to enter into the space of his kingdom. And for the sheer joy of it they started to work. They did not allow themselves to be held back by, or they did not waste their time on worrying what account they would have to give of it in the end. For them, working on God's kingdom has its own rewards here and now.

In the end, this parable is about accountability, but it is also about believing in the mission entrusted to us. Do we live in fear, or do we acknowledge the greatness of our call? God doesn't want us to remain idle and to be satisfied with minimal efforts in view of the kingdom. God wants us to give away everything and to reach out to others. This is the only way we will receive the approval of the Son of Man.

If we work only out of fear, what kind of gospel have we received? This parable comes almost at the end of our liturgical year, so as to invite us to assess what we have achieved-or failed to achieve over the fifty some weeks of the ending liturgical year. Have we made more talents with those we have received? Have we moved forward and made our family, our community, our society grow richer? Or have we buried our talents, fearing to be criticized or to be rebuked? Each one of us has that talent freely given by God. We have received it not to bury it, but to use it; not out of fear, but out of confidence and pride, knowing that by our doing, God's kingdom of love can be brought a little bit closer. The parable reminds us that we all have talents. Maybe not spectacular or dramatic like other people who get national or international acclaim; just ordinary, but nevertheless important.

Let us be legal tender for the Kingdom
