
Our Vision

From Fr. William's Desk

This week's gospel is a tough one for many people to hear. We grow up being taught the importance of basic fairness as part of learning right from wrong. And here goes Jesus apparently being quite unfair. Today we are invited to reflect on the lessons of a generous God. We struggle with a God so generous! The Gospel today is not a description

of a labor negotiation--where fairness is paramount--

but rather as a revelation about the abundance of God's love where everybody who shows up gets all there is to get. How big is your God? How broad are your thoughts? How loving is your heart? Those who are challenged by this reading don't seem to notice that the person they're arguing with is lesus, and the cause they're arguing for is less mercy. What would they prefer: more wrath? The surprising answer is yes—so long as it's aimed at someone else!

The Gospel today gives us a taste of what God is like. There is something foolish in God's generosity, in his kind of justice. But it is a foolishness that is utterly creative. It is a foolishness that led Jesus to his death on the cross: humanly speaking a complete failure. And yet as Christians, we say that this lesus is the corner stone of a new humanity. God keeps reaching out and calling us to work in the vineyard; God will always surprise us by being overwhelmingly generous and merciful to each one of us. It would be interesting to ask: where do we see ourselves in this parable? What if it were meant for our community? Who would be the first? The last? We all know that jealously and envy is found in Christian communities. It amazes and sometimes stuns me how people feel entitled to places of distinction or leadership in a church community and become upset, talk about, gossip and undermine people who see a new vision, a bigger picture?

I think it is a great comfort to us that God is most unpredictable when it comes to his superabundant mercy. God does unlikely things because he is God. That same God invites you and me to be generous! Our faith is a practical faith and often the trenches are busy places! God deals with both the devout and sinner in the same fashion: generously. God's grace pours out on all, whether they have earned it or not. All sorts of strange and surprising things happen that sometimes defy human expectations and ways of doing things.
