From Fr. William's Desk

The parable in today's Gospel refers to a change of fortunes by offering a simple, conventional morality tale that tells of the reversal of earthly roles after death. The story reflects the classic Lucan theme of "great reversals," by which Luke sees God turning things upside down in order to compel us to look at a particular truth, in this case, how we use wealth.

It was not the wealth of the rich man that Jesus condemned, it was his self-indulgence that Jesus condemns. He belonged to a group who didn't believe in afterlife so "here today, gone tomorrow; live it up." Sound familiar? His eating, a symbol of self-indulgence, makes him oblivious to the poor around him. His "eating" literally "eats him up." Lazarus (which means God helps), on the other hand, doesn't want riches. He just wants something to eat - he "longs for the scraps." But later he enjoys companionship with God. The difference is this: The rich man was complete in himself with his glad rags and prime cuts. Material things, alone, filled him up. When they were gone he didn't know what to do.

What saved Lazarus was not that he was poor. What saved him was that he "could long for more." "Longing" is a key word in Luke. When a person has a sense of longing, there is a sense of oneself as being incomplete, unfulfilled. Lazarus knew there were places in his heart that could be filled only by God. Lazarus has no food, but he has a spirit. He was capable of faith and hope. The rich man was satisfied. Nothing left to long for. And when longing in life is absent, we're doomed to live in the present.

How far is our love and compassion obliged to go? Someone once asked Jesus: "Who is my neighbor?" The response wasn't comforting: essentially, everyone, including my enemy. Jesus takes down those walls brick by brick with teachings about loving enemies, blessing those who curse us, returning good for evil and forgiveness for injury. When Jesus forgives his murderers from the cross, there's nowhere to hide from the truth: We can't wash our hands of anyone. Charity may begin at home, but it can't stay there.
