But that is not what happened! Jesus' message of love and mercy has spread across the earth. Today we join millions of people in all parts of the world to celebrate with great joy the Incarnation, the birth of Jesus, God stepping into our history, stepping into our story, and never ever leaving us.

Christmas is one of the greatest celebrations of the liturgical year. No words can truly express the miracle of that holy night, when two thousand years ago the 13.8 billion year history of the universe was changed by the birth of a tiny baby. We celebrate this phenomenal event every year, trying to grasp a little more deeply the significance of the Incarnation. We celebrate the birth of Jesus, the stable, the angels and the shepherds, the kings and the star. We remember the holy night with wonder and gratitude when God touched the universe and spoke his word of love. Nothing was ever the same.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only-begotten son, full of grace and truth.
