#### **Reflections from the Gospel Gals**

O Come, O Come Emmanual

May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in the love for you. (1Thessalonians 3.12)

This Sunday, as we begin a new liturgical year, we will light the first candle on our Advent wreath. The lights on the candles bring light into the shorter and darker days of December and they remind us that of the light of Christ that we anticipate during this season. The Advent candles readily demonstrate the contrast between darkness and light. Christ is referred to as the 'light of the world' contrasted with the darkness of sin. As his Advent, or "coming" draws near another candle is lit, dispelling the darkness a little more.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Saviour's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming. (CCC524) Just as Israel eagerly awaited the coming of the Messiah, we now await his second coming.

The origin of Advent can be traced back to the 4<sup>th</sup> century. The church in France used the period before Epiphany as a time of preparation for Baptism. Advent as we know it today was developed in Rome. Pope Gregory I in the late 6<sup>th</sup> /early 7<sup>th</sup> C composed many of the prayers, antiphons, and psalm responses. Advent is the time of preparation before Christmas. The first two weeks of Advent are anticipating Christ's second coming, which is particularly reflected in the Mass readings from the Old and New Testaments. Then on the third Sunday, called "Gaudete" (Latin for rejoice) Sunday, the emphasis shifts to Jesus' birth.

The Advent wreath is a popular tradition that originated in Germany. An Advent wreath consists of four candles (three purple, signifying penance, and one rose, signifying joy), surrounded by evergreen branches. The 4 candles represent the 4 weeks of Advent. A tradition that each week represents one thousand years, to a sum of the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding the Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead. The light again signifies Christ, the Light of the world. For thousands of years, the world has waited for the coming of the Messiah to redeem and save the human race, restoring mankind's relationship with God.

We light the first candle, to remind us of the hope the people of Israel had for the coming Messiah. We light the second candle to remind us of the peace that enters our lives as we experience the presence of Jesus Christ. We light the third candle to remind us of the joy the angels proclaimed when Jesus was born. And we light the fourth candle to remind us of the love that God shares with us through the birth of his son.

Let this be a time when we are grateful for God's presence, that we let his light shine upon us and that we be the light onto others. His Love is the gift that we have be given.


