Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - December 4th 2022 Second Sunday of Advent

As we light the second candle, let's take the time to ponder, to reflect, to open our hearts to the small still voice of God. Advent is a favorite time of waiting, of sitting in the flickering softness of candlelight, letting the light of our Messiah lead us to a rebirth. There is a growing sense of being enveloped by a profusion of love. We are called to enter our hearts where repentance and preparation are essential in order to emerge into a renewed sense of harmony and new life.

The stump of Jesse is a good image to reflect on during this second week of Advent. It tells the story of Israel's destruction in the 8th century B.C. Israel was cut down by the Assyrian invaders. War, devastation and death left nothing but a dead decaying stump. Their pride and reliance on their own strength caused this annihilation. The sin of arrogance and self-reliance continues to flourish in our world today. It pulls us away from God and creates a barrier to God's healing grace. What 'stump' is rotting our hearts today? Advent offers us time to recognize, confess, and repent our sinfulness. Take the time to lean into the promises of God and rest in God's continuous flow of mercy.

Repent isn't a "feelings" word. It is an *action* word. John the Baptist tells us to change the direction of our hearts, our lives, not merely 'to feel sorry' for what we have done. The Messiah King is coming and repentance is our response. Real repentance will show itself in life. It has to be a matter of *living* repentance, not just *talking* repentance. God does not want us to passively receive the Word; God wants us to live the Word in the world today!

With God, anything is possible, and from this barren stump, a tender, vulnerable shoot emerges from the house of David. Through Joseph, Mary, and Jesus, through their humility and obedience, the lineage is restored. Just like our hearts, with humility and obedience to God's will, we come before God and rest in God's nurturing tenderness, allowing the continuous outflow of mercy and grace to transform us. Let us renew our commitment to the possibilities God has in store for us.

God promises us a new order, a new way of being, a restructuring of priorities. The new 'king' of the world will be endowed with the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, counsel and might, knowledge and fear of the Lord. This king will rule with the Word of God, with justice and faithfulness; God's righteousness will flourish. All of creation will live in harmony and full knowledge of the Lord.

The Spirit of the Lord rests on us as well. Do we let the Spirit of God direct our hearts? Lord, help us to speak and act with integrity; help us to bring peace in the world to all our relationships – with others, with the animals, with the whole of God's creation. As the Advent light increases, may our hearts burn with the desire to embrace ever more fully the Christ child – Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
