Reflections from the Gospel Gals

On the Second Sunday of Advent we continue to prepare to celebrate the nativity of Christ. John the Baptist's call to conversion is an invitation to open our hearts and welcome the Son of God. We light the second purple candle which represents Love. This candle also reminds us of the Peace that enters our lives as we experience the presence of Jesus Christ. Here are some of the reflections of Advent I would like to share with you.

Advent is our season of spiritual preparation for remembering Christ's first coming as a human baby, but also for His continued presence with us today through the Holy Spirit and in the anticipation we have of His final return. We reflect on the mystery of the incarnation. It is not just that God became man, as I quote... "For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

Advent is a time of waiting. Are we not always waiting? Even God waited for Mary's answer. I now see that waiting is actually a prayer. Our active waiting can come in so many forms; asking for help, guidance, gifts, jobs, answers and graces. Thus, the customs of Advent help to open our hearts and celebrate the season through our spiritual reflection and joyful expectations.

The Advent wreath symbolizes eternity. Lighting the candles represent the coming of the Light of Christ. Excitedly, children light more candles as the winter season evolves. There is more and more light! Through the presence of the Holy Spirit, we can really experience the presence of Jesus on our earthly journey. What is God forming in us? Do we see the light shining through all our physicality and materialism?

Our journey as Christians is one of Hope. As the divine radiant light of God touches the human heart, we are encouraged to be actively, courageously, and intellectually receptive. Growing our spiritual awareness takes us away from ordinary thoughts by means of observing differences and drawing distinctions and belonging to the whole by an innate perception of kinship. To me this speaks of kindness to one another. So, as we turn off the "ordinary" thoughts, let our hearts stay open and know that we are all part of God's heart forever.

It was St Francis of Assisi who opened our eyes to embrace the wonderful celebration of Christmas. This is a time of feasting and is basically saying: it is good to be human; it is good to be on this earth and to be of flesh and emotions. This is what God Loves. Our hearts are always waiting for new apparitions in which the Spirit is revealed. Whenever that happens we are celebrating Christmas!

May the radiance of God's Love shine on you.
