SUNDAY February 10, 2019 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's readings are deeply personal to me. A key question I struggled with for many years prior to my ordination was, whom does God choose? Why? I chose these readings for my first mass coming on 15 years this August. Last Sunday we read about the call of Jeremiah, and today we have the vocation stories of Isaiah and the apostle Peter. One might ask: "Why these guys? What was God thinking? But this is really nothing new for the God of surprises. These readings describe how the giants of our tradition experienced their being called by God. All three feel not up to it, what God calls them to, for they know their hands and heart were not clean. It goes way back!! Think about the following -

Abraham is made a new father in his old age; slow-tongued Moses takes on Pharaoh; young shepherd David is chosen as king, and Saul the persecutor becomes Paul the apostle. It is clear that God does whatever God wills. The characters that God has chosen throughout history to be instruments of justice, mercy, love and compassion have been brave, earthy individuals. We could be wrong to disqualify ourselves from ever being called by God to be his instruments. We may intellectually understand that God has chosen many people like ourselves to be his workers; but too often it ends there, if spiritually we lower our heads, and leave it to others to follow God's call.

After the extraordinary catch of fish, Peter was suddenly aware of his own weakness and unworthiness. Surely, he did not deserve such generosity from Jesus! Then Peter discovers that the Lord has chosen him and has a great purpose for him, in spite of his faults. From now on he will gather people into the net of God's kingdom. God's purpose for us does not depend on our virtue or worthiness. He does not wait for us to be worthy before calling us to a share in his loving service to others. Indeed, our very sense of unworthiness creates an opening for Christ to work through us. If, like Peter, we are called to work with Jesus, we will do so as wounded healers, trying to practice what we preach. In our fears and doubts it is good to remember the three giants of our tradition were men who felt unworthy and were in every sense of the word, sinners. Yet, they had a surprising, forgiving, and overwhelming experience of the love of God. That encounter of grace enabled them to rise above doubt, fear and their own sinfulness. Only then were they able to say. "Here I am, send me."

When we are being told by Jesus to pull out into the deep, I don't think it is out of place for us to object, like Peter and other prophets, to God's foolish choice in us. But we must also be prepared to let ourselves be won over by God's grace, for it is God's pledge that with his power at work in us, we can perform deeds that we never thought ourselves capable of. It is all part of the fact that in God's eyes we are, in spite of our weakness and insignificance, the stuff of which God's kingdom is built.

May we be gathered into God's nets,
