SUNDAY February 23, 2020 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Each Sunday, before Father reads the Gospel, we make the sign of the cross on our forehead, lips and heart. It's our prayer to God, asking that His Word be in our thoughts, on our lips, and in our hearts. We are asked to take the Gospel and make it our own, to live it in our day to day. But, with this week's Gospel I find this hard to do. I get stuck thinking it applies to folks like Mahatma Gandhi and Martin Luther King. How do I apply this Gospel in my life? I've been thinking about it for weeks ... and I believe it's all that thinking that has me stuck. God's Word is meant to feed our soul; to do that we need to allow the Gospel to move from our head to our heart. Only with prayer, trust, faith and God's grace will we hear what we each need to hear.

Today's Gospel is part of the Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus gives his disciples, and us, God's blueprint for how we are to live our lives. Jesus tells us that it's all about love, mercy and forgiveness; not about following rules and laws. No longer is it an eye for an eye or a tooth for a tooth, but instead we are told, if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. On the cross Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do," revealing His infinite mercy and compassion to those who persecuted Him. Jesus lived today's message, do !?

For me, I need to start at home. Turning the other cheek is not easy for me to do with family; we all know each other's buttons to push. Why is it I can listen to a stranger's story, take the time to find out who they are as a person, and yet at home I go on autopilot, the angry words are out of my mouth before I know it? It hurts me to see how my words wound those I love ... why do I do it? Where is the forgiveness? In today's Gospel Jesus tells us to stand up for what is right and just, but our response has to come from the heart. Jesus modeled this for us in His ministry; His every word, His every encounter came from a place of love. A few years back, when world leaders were talking about closing their borders to refugees, Pope Francis, with compassion and love washed and kissed the feet of Muslim refugees. That moment was so powerful; it "melted my heart". In his response we see and feel Jesus' love being mirrored back to us. It's humbling and transforming. That's Jesus' way.

My walk of faith is not smooth; often it's two steps forward and one step back. But that's ok. Our God is patient. He knows we're all works in progress; we are the ones that forget that about each other sometimes. Like the sun and the rain, God's love has no borders and falls on all his children no matter where we are on our journey. So, as we enter into Lent this week let's keep our eyes on Jesus. Let's really open our hearts, talk less, listen more. Let's turn the other cheek, remembering God turns the other cheek to us always, with His love and forgiveness.
