SUNDAY - January 23, 2022 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nothing will be lacking in the reign Jesus came to establish. This is how the word is "fulfilled in our hearing," then and now. We are given the promise that God will supply all that is presently lacking, and Jesus remains the sign of that pledge, our "new and everlasting covenant" present in the Eucharist as he was to the folks in Nazareth. Today is holy, and it's time to rejoice.

I bet it took Jesus awhile to find his voice too. to grow into it... so to speak! "Today".... this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing! Sometimes I wonder if Jesus was "out of touch with reality". I look around the world today and don't see a lot of "Good News". I think Jesus can say: today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing because he knew and knows that throughout history there have been people who insist on being compassionate, fair, and courageous. I think Jesus could say that "today ... is fulfilled" because he looked beyond the surface of things. The society he lived in was, perhaps, worse than ours today. Roman soldiers were trampling the land, raping, and killing and oppressing. People were losing their homes, their families, meaningful work, and dignity. Jesus knew we could do better than violence and hate. He knew the seed is within us, the seed of God's Spirit. So, he says "Today" - live with compassion today - be a healer... today - help yourself and others be whole-y. ..today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in you. How do you react when you hear that this scripture passage is fulfilled in you? . When the Israelites heard God's word, they wept. When the disciples first heard it in Galilee, they didn't always understand. When the Corinthians heard it, they started arguing. Sound familiar?

In the spirit of the readings this week, we too have been sent by God; send with real gifts to meet the needs of real people. If we ever feel to burdened and lack confidence, we are assured by God's own promise that what we must bring is exactly what is needed by others. Did you ever stop to think that you have the gift to enrich someone's life, set them free, as Christ puts it in the Gospel, from the chains of their own inabilities and fears? I once read somewhere Christ promises to open the doors to our cells, he doesn't promise to drag us out of them. Through Paul's imagery he tells us clearly, each one of us, "We need what you have to give, and we Christians have a great deal to give to the world. This indeed is a time of favor from the Lord. Come together Christians and rejoice in it.

In the coming Sunday's we will see this Jesus, we will feel this Jesus and we will be invited to reflect on the mission entrusted to us. What we see, feel, and do is intended to deepen us, change us, and mold us into our being His Disciples. All of us are students in the school of life. In that school we are invited to lessen the divisions wherever they may be in our church communities, in our homes or in our hearts. We too need to stand up and open the scroll and tell the truth in love. Maybe you could go home today and write your eulogy and reflect on what you write? Who are you? Are you doing what you were born to do? The work of any believer is not only the work of a human individual but is actually the work of the Holy Spirit. -The late Coptic Pope Shenouda III
