## SUNDAY - January 8th, 2023 The Epiphany of the Lord

In the Gospel this week, it is Matthew's turn to give us a hint about the significance of Jesus born in Bethlehem. The device that Matthew uses is the story about a few wise men coming from the East, who inquire about Jesus. The issue for Matthew is that people, of whom you never would have expected it, are inquiring about Jesus. They are open and receptive to him. Of all people, this time it is the pagans who are prepared to acknowledge Jesus for who he is. The story of how the wise men from the East recognize Jesus for who he really is full of irony. There are other actors in the story that we too easily overlook. The men from the East, like the shepherds, are supposed to be ignorant in religious matters. They are the last ones you would consult when it comes to things about God. The scribes and the chief priests, on the other hand, are the religious experts. They know all there is to know about God. They know from the Scriptures where Jesus is to be born, so they have no difficulty telling pagans where Jesus can be found. But then they stalled. They refuse to draw, from what they know so well, the consequences and practical implications for their own lives. They refuse to go along to Bethlehem; they cannot get themselves on their knees for this Jesus. They remain at a safe distance from him. In fact, they begin to plot against him, and devise ways to get rid of him, because he upsets their little game and exposes their hunger for power.

The story invites us to recognize ourselves either in the wise men from the East or the wise men living in Jerusalem. The men in the East are wise because they ask themselves questions, important questions. They are not so sure of themselves and allow themselves to be led by a star, by a sign of hope that is being tested on the book of hope, the scriptures. The way Matthew puts the story together makes it of lasting significance to us. Are we prepared, like the shepherds and the wise men from the East, to leave the familiar and set out in search of God, in whatever unfamiliar and even unsettling ways he may make himself known to us? Are we prepared to let him change our lives? Or are we like Herod, the chief priests and the scribes, so protective of our own little world that anxious to keep God effectively out of our lives and our world or church view.

There is an interesting, not insignificant detail at the end of the story. When the wise men had found Jesus Christ, when they had acknowledged and adored him, they returned to their own country by a different way. Their encounter with the Lord, their leader and shepherd, had changed them. It had made new people out of them. We need to, "depart... by another way." Our journey re-routed by the One we have seen. I want to focus on what it means to be wise! We are the wise and we are the foolish, we are Herod and we shepherds... saint and sinner! So, what makes a person wise? What star will you follow this year? More than anything, being able to see into the future is essential for our faith lives. Our thirst for justice requires us to imagine a better world where peace reigns long before the fighting stops; our hope for salvation assumes a vision of our

best selves long before we set selfish and foolish ways aside. And finally, as the Magi discovered, our search for wisdom calls us to listen to our dreams and follow the star that will lead us to where love—the light of the world—lies waiting for us. Epiphany blessings.
