#### **Reflections from the Gospel Gals**

In today's gospel we hear that people of affluence, power, prestige and influence gave generously to the treasury. By contrast a woman, a widowed woman, the epitome of the marginalized in her society, gave all she had, which was pretty much nothing. Amidst the swagger of those who reviled her, she courageously gave everything she had to God. Jesus said she had given more than the others! It is in this context that 'giving' becomes the backdrop to a radical invitation, to a way of living, an imperative.

In this comparison then, what is the radical invitation, the imperative that is given to us? Stated simply, it is to give our very being to God, our every thought, desire and decision, *everything* without hesitation or reservation. Jesus is asking us to detach ourselves from the things that the world values, that they not rule our lives, that they not define us and not be our identity; that we know that everything we have is from God. Jesus is asking us for a radical change of attitude and a radical change of heart, a total surrender to God, in trust and belief. The change is from 'self' to 'life'.

When we give ourselves to God as those of affluence did, we give only part of ourselves to God and on our terms. We are hesitant and we hold back in our relationship with God. We may see our abundance in life, our achievements, skills, talents, time and treasures as blessings, but too often we believe we are the ones largely responsible for what we have and who we have become. We believe our efforts, hard work and judicious stewardship gave us these things. Basically, we believe that we are the 'makers', that we are in control and in such we risk becoming arrogant, exclusive and judgemental.

When we give ourselves to God as the widow did, we hold nothing back. We start each day humbly offering ourselves to God for we know that we are of God, the Almighty One. We know that apart from God we have nothing and we can do nothing. We know that everything we have and who we are, whether great or small by human standards, is God's free and generous gift to us having nothing to do with merit or deserving for our part. We, in turn, generously re-gift ourselves in service to others as Jesus did.

When we choose to live in total surrender to God, doing God's will becomes our life and in doing so we know that we are faithful to the second of God's two great commandments – 'we love one another as we love ourselves'. When we give ourselves completely, "unhindered in mind and body", to God we seem to begin a new journey to a new place. We begin to get but the smallest glimpse of the eternal God. We begin to see the greatness and vastness of God, an incomprehensible understanding of God and we bow before him in awe and worship. We may have no words but we know we are in the company of God, Pure Love. It is then and there that the first commandment, 'love the Lord our God with our whole heart, with our whole mind and with our whole strength' takes form and becomes our life. We, like the widow, love God simply and above all because He is God, beyond what words can convey, yet the very Magnificence that loves us first.

-Becoming Human by Jean Vanier; the founder of l'Arche reminds us of what the "examined life" means.

-<u>A Daughter's Love</u> by John Guy, a foremost British historian tells us how Thomas More's daughter, Meg, bravely supported him during his imprisonment and eventual execution by Henry VIII.

-<u>In the Steps of St. Paul</u> by H V Morton (in 1934-35 with Paul's letters in hand): the paths taken, and the villages and cities visited --- Corinth, Athens, Antioch, Ephesus, Jerusalem etc. --- barely thirty lifetimes ago. A remarkable travelogue, by a famous travel writer.
