Reflections from the Gospel Gals

The discourse in today's Gospel reading from Mark takes place between Jesus and his disciples. They were speaking about the "end, which is to come". Following some description of the cataclysmic events that will precede this event, we are told, "Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place." It is difficult to understand what Jesus meant unless we go back in this Chapter and get some context. The disciples and Jesus had been sitting and admiring the Temple; Jesus' comment refers to its impending destruction. As we approach the end of the Liturgical year we also read into Jesus' words a description of the end of time, the Second Coming. We are told there will be warnings. We are to be watchful and we are to be prepared.

Last weekend a group of our neighbours got together to discuss the level of earthquake preparedness in the households on our street. This was prompted by the recent large quakes reported off of the coast of the Island. It turns out we're not all that ready to deal with 'the big one' when it hits, individually or collectively. We put forth a plan to be followed up in six months: prepare for your household and help put together a neighbourhood kit that may help those who have not prepared well. That may or may not be adequate. Time will tell and it will depend on how diligent each of us is in filling the gaps of our current level of preparedness. It will depend on us focusing and keeping the goal in our line of sight.

When it comes to our Spiritual life what does preparedness look like? We're not necessarily talking about the Second Coming. Each of us will probably face our own mortality before that event comes to pass. What do we need to do to truly feel ready to meet our Judge? What if the things of life like finances, status, job security, personal success or family issues distract us? Our Faith life will take a 'back seat' and there may be little Spiritual preparedness.

Every year at this time we get a nudge. It is meant to be encouragement from our loving Saviour who walked this earth, who was tempted as we are tempted. Jesus understands and he has our ultimate welfare at heart. "For I know well the plans I have in mind for you - plans for your welfare and not for woe, so as to give you a future of hope. When you call me, and come and pray to me, I will listen to you. When you look for me, you will find me. Yes, when you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me ..." Jeremiah 29: 11 - 14

Don't be distracted. Establish a relationship with your Lord; you will be heard. Pray. Seek the Lord with all your heart. Then you will be closer to fulfilling the First Commandment. Fulfill your tasks here on earth. We each have been provided special talents and God had a plan when he gave us those specific talents. 'Unwrap' those gifts and use them for the greater good. Love your neighbour as yourself.

Fill in the gaps of the current level of preparedness in your Spiritual life. Focus and keep the goal in sight. We do not know the day or hour. Embrace the words of Jesus; have hope. Fulfill your mission. And pray for those who cannot pray for themselves. We're in this together! Blessings on your week, Sheila Wall

A potpourri of great reading --- books most often signed out.

- -Mere Christianity by C S Lewis (famed popularly for the Chronicles of Narnia). On Right and Wrong, the meaning of the universe, belief & behaviour. Lewis, ranking with Chesterton as a great apologist for Christianity.
- -Becoming Human by Jean Vanier; the founder of l'Arche reminds us of what the "examined life" means.
- -A Daughter's Love by John Guy, a foremost British historian tells us how Thomas More's daughter, Meg, bravely supported him during his imprisonment and eventual execution by Henry VIII.
- -In the Steps of St. Paul by H V Morton (in 1934-35 with Paul's letters in hand): the paths taken, and the villages and cities visited --- Corinth, Athens, Antioch, Ephesus, Jerusalem etc. --- barely thirty lifetimes ago. A remarkable travelogue, by a famous travel writer.
- <u>-Cities of God</u> by Rodney Stark tells us, and with evidence, how Christianity became an urban movement and conquered Rome within three centuries. How and why did Christianity spread so quickly.
