SUNDAY - November 28, 2021 First Sunday in Advent

It is hard to compete with the consumer culture of celebrating Christmas before entering Advent, but I will try! Why do we light an advent wreathe? Why do I buy advent resources each year? Dear friends, faith preparation for Christmas is especially important! The Advent season deals with an aspect of the Christian life that none of us can do without. In fact, if that aspect were missing from our lives, we might wonder whether we could still call ourselves Christians. That aspect is hope. One of the greatest blessings of Advent is its insistence that we as a Christian community, and as individual Christians, expose ourselves to hope. In whatever way it is described, whether it is with the help of some strange images, as in the reading of today, or whether it is with the help of the prophets of the Hebrew Scriptures, or with such personalities of John the Baptist or the Virgin Mary during the next few Sunday's, everything can be pulled together under the theme of a summons to hope. We watch, hope and wait!

What does that Jesus who waits for us to return to him say this advent? So, I share this question with you this year: What are we waiting for? Is it the "joyful hope of the coming of our savior, Jesus Christ," as we say at Mass? Are we waiting for a baby to be born, a king to come, a world to end and a new one to take its place? Are we waiting in joyful hope for the reign of God at the end of human history, a time of justice and peace, a future where the meek shall inherit the Earth and the poor will have good news delivered to them at last? How do we live until then? With hope—the hope of a prophet who still hopes though he is sitting in prison amidst the siege of his holy city. With watchfulness and prayer, undistracted by the false certainties of the pleasures and "anxieties of daily life." And with confidence, heads held high like a people ready for a new Exodus to freedom, because they know what they have to do and that their "redemption is at hand."

Jean Allen writes there is mystery and freedom in waiting, in being entwined with the Lord in longing, hope and trust and expecting him in eager stillness or still eagerness. "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; yes, wait for the Lord." (Psalm 27:14) Wait for him to come. Watch for him. To do otherwise is utter futility. Be still. Advent is the pilgrimage of waiting. Make quiet your anxious heart. Can you hear it? Someone is coming... Thomas Merton writes...the Advent mystery is the beginning of the end of all in us that is not yet Christ.

Let us wait in hope! Father William

William" asking for a "favor" which usually leads to gift cards and/or cash please IGNORE this message. Often the initial message is an invitation to call or email him back. IGNORE that also. Fr. William has never, will never and would never contact parishioners with this kind of request.
