Reflections from the Gospel Gals

The rich man who approaches Jesus in today's Gospel must have been feeling pretty confident. Before even asking Jesus what he must do to obtain Eternal Life, the man is aware that he observes all the Commandments and has done so since his youth. It was a great shock to him to be told that that was not enough. He was required to sell all his possessions and give the money to the poor.

Mark, I have come to understand, really packs the teaching into his Gospels. Today's reading has many deep and valuable messages starting with the opener, above. When we come to God feeling like we haven't broken any of the rules we might think we've done okay too. At some point in my life I felt like this was true and that that was enough. But I have come to know that this was the understanding only of my immature Christian self. Thankfully, as I have grown in my Faith I have become aware that I am continually being drawn forward; I am called to more. I will always be called to more just as this rich man is. Jesus is asking him to give up his worldly passion, his possessions, and grow his faith to include a loving relationship with his fellow man. Then he was to follow Jesus as we are called to follow Jesus, to walk with those in need – the marginalized, the poor, the lonely, the sick, the hungry, the grieving. This is the cornerstone of Catholic social justice.

The rich man went away grieving because of what Jesus asked of him; he could not let go of his material things. Jesus responds by telling the perplexed disciples how hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the Kingdom of God. Jesus continues, addressing the disciples as 'Children', to emphasize that this is the most basic of teachings; he reiterates his message. And the disciples counter with the question, then who can be saved? They don't get it.

And now, we get lesson number two. 'For humans it is impossible, but not for God.' On our own we will flounder. There are too many competing, enticing worldly interests. We need the grace of God. In my own life I understand that I did not grow in my faith by myself; it was only by the grace of God. I am blessed to have had people who have prayed for me, been an example for me and who have made a personal invitation to 'come and see'. That was the grace of God acting in my life. Being invited to the Alpha Course in my Parish in Kingston was a turning point in my faith life. There, I found community and deep, profound witness. The Grace of God flooded into my life. God gives us all the grace we need, freely and without measure. We only need to be open to it and accept it. And we are called to be conduits of this grace: pray for others, be a Christian witness and make that personal invitation to someone who needs it.

There are blessings for those who lose attachment to things and adopt a spirit of loving those around us says Jesus. We will be rewarded here on earth – lesson three. But, we will face persecution – lesson four. It is not easy to live out a Christian life, as it is so counter-cultural. To stay the course depends on our humility of Spirit and our perseverance, possible through the grace of our loving Father.

Best lesson of all? Lesson five: We will gain Eternal Life!
