SUNDAY - October 2, 2022 Twenty-seventh Sunday of Ordinary Time

When we listen to the news nowadays, we drown in the quagmire of devastation. The violence and injustice make us cry out to God just like Habakkuk, and there seems to be no end in sight. We feel God has abandoned us. Even Jesus cried, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Yet it is in Christ that we place our faith, a crucified sacrificial servant of God. Our faith is being put to the test...do we step up or do we walk away...do we believe that God has it in hand or do we focus on hopelessness? It's in times like these that we need to place what little faith we have into God's hands, to trust in God's promises, to cling to God with courage and conviction.

The book of Habakkuk reminds us that while God may seem silent and uninvolved in our world, God always has a plan, no place is too dark and no wall too thick for God's grace to penetrate in a powerful and life-affirming way. There is always HOPE!

Having hope means accepting and acting out of God's generous gift of a spirit of power and of love and of selfdiscipline. God's power is not 'over' us, rather God's power is 'with' us and within us. The power of LOVE for God, one another and self, along with the power of SERVICE gives us the courage and resolve to meet difficulties and dangers head on. We must hold fast to Christ Jesus, to the one true foundation, to profess our Creed and live it in the world with faith and love as we adhere to the voice of the Good Shepherd.

God gifts each of us, and each of us are needed to bring about God's design. Sometimes fear keeps us from using our gifts. We doubt, we hesitate, we panic, and in the process, we forget that fear does not come from God. Rather, fear comes from a lack of faith in God. If fear is stopping us from fully committing to God and effecting God's plan, we are called to place our faith into God's power, which makes all things possible.

The mulberry tree roots were thought to be extraordinarily strong, like our deeply rooted fears, unforgiveness and bitterness. If our mustard seed faith is deeply rooted in God, we can accomplish great things!

We are called to live in the sure faith of Christ Jesus by relying on the strength of God, leaning into the joys and sorrows of life, and standing confidently in God's all-encompassing love. We are never alone as Christ relentlessly fashions us into His disciples. It's not about *how much* faith we have, it's about what *kind* of faith we have. We may think we have heaps of faith yet sit piously in church praying and judging and tearing down the Kingdom. Or our faith may be precarious, even shaky, yet our hearts are chockfull of love, compassion, humility, and a deep desire to serve God.

Let us walk according to the Spirit plowing the land, the soil, and the heart; tending the sheep, the church, and the people; serving the poor, the marginalized, and the broken. Our faith is a hands on faith that requires hard work, patience, and a caring heart each and every day. Pope Francis says, "You have to trust God. God's love calls us to move beyond fear. We ask God for the courage to put on faith, hope and love as we go out into the world and become the Word in body as well as spirit."
