Reflections from the Gospel Gals

Today's gospel about 'two becoming one' and 'permanent bonds', echo long and run deep. At its core, oneness is focused outward, on the 'other', selfless and self-sacrificing, seeking the best for the other, to do the other's will. Oneness is about the bond between Jesus and his father, the inseparable bond that Jesus has formed with us and the bonds of oneness that we form in our relationships in equality and unity.

Jesus knew of his oneness with his father. He said, "The father and I are one." In this oneness Jesus knew it was his mission to do his father's will. "I must be about my father's business", he said. Jesus lived every day to bring glory to his father; he stayed connected with his father. He would often steal away to pray, to talk and to draw strength from his father. Amidst the ups and downs of everyday life Jesus worked to do his father's will. Throngs of people were always around Jesus some to be healed, others to hear his radical message of love and some, like the Pharisees and their spies, to trick, trap and discredit Jesus. He talked to rich and poor, good and bad alike and he dined with all who invited him. There were times when his friends were grieved and disappointed with Jesus as the time when he was not there to heal Lazarus. Jesus never faltered. Right up to the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus prayed 'not my will but yours be done'. He did his father's will - he freely laid down his life - he loved us to the cross, to the resurrection, to life.

"The one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are all from one". Jesus sanctifies and we are the sanctified. The bond that Jesus made with us is not to be 'put asunder'. We are one with Jesus, with all that God created and our work is to live out of this sanctified oneness. How do we do this? We do it exactly as Jesus did it. We stay connected with God. We spend a lot of time with God in prayer and listening to forge a very deep relationship with Jesus. We draw strength from God so that we may 'bloom where we are planted', whatever our circumstances. We keep 'eyes on Jesus' and we live to do his will, every day, 'his will not ours be done'. We work side by side with Jesus to live out his kingdom on earth and to bring his kingdom to others. He gives us life that we may give life to others.

My story is similar to that of many. Years ago, my dad died young leaving a 42 year old widow with seven young children and not much to live on. After my dad's death I saw that my mom ceased to live for herself in any way. Instead, she lived for her children. When there was never a minute to spare she made sure to eke out time to pray, to connect with her God and to be comforted by him. She did this every single day. Years later, I finally understood it. My mom had lived out of her oneness with Jesus; she did his will. She freely laid down her life and God gave it back to her.

All of us are on the road of continual conversion to unbroken, sanctified oneness with Jesus and with everyone, in all of our relationships. Let's embrace it, cherish it and live it with joy and gratitude.

In lock-step with Jesus, all the way!
