Reflections from the Gospel Gals

In today's Gospel, Jesus leads the disciples into unfamiliar territory, into a land where foreign gods are worshipped. It is here that Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" The question is not difficult, and we, like the disciples, would be quick to respond. But then Jesus asks, "But who do you say that I am?' Only Peter responds, "You are the Christ." For a moment all is good, until Jesus teaches them about the suffering he must go through; His death on the cross and His rising up on the third day. What they were hearing made no sense. Peter takes Jesus aside and tells Him, these things can not happen to their Messiah. Poor Peter, one second God reveals to him who Jesus is and in the next second Peter's human nature kicks in; he is not ready to follow Jesus.

How about us, how do we answer Jesus when he asks us, "But who do **you** say that I am?" Jesus reveals himself to us in stages. The Jesus we knew as a child is very different from the Jesus we know as an adult.

Not that Jesus changes; we do. Sixteen years ago, my sister was in a coma and on a respirator in ICU. For a week I pleaded with God to heal my sister. One day while I was sitting alone in the quiet room, I noticed a bible on the table and when I picked it up, it opened to the gospel where Jesus raises Lazarus. I was filled with hope and I was convinced God was going to cure her. Two days later my sister passed away. Like Peter, I too had a conversation with Jesus. All these years later, I see that opening the Bible to the story of Lazarus was not about opening my sister's eyes, but it was meant for me to open mine.

Why is it that when all is well in our lives we are more than happy to follow Jesus? But during the times we are struggling we once again want to take control and let Jesus know what we need from Him.

In Isaiah our Lord says, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are my ways your ways," And yet, like Peter in today's gospel we try redirecting the will of God to our own limited understanding. We must remember that God loved us first; he loves us now exactly as we are. We are children of God. Jesus says follow him and He will take us to God.

Like a small child on their first day of school they know that their destination is school, but to get there they must take their parent's hand and follow. We, as Christians know our destination is Eternal Life. Jesus is waiting for us to give Him our hand, He will lead us there, all we must do is follow Him. But, like Peter, we will have times in our life when we too will pull our hand away. Jesus is always there to pull us back and when needed, He carries us.

So this week in our conversations with Jesus let us pray for total trust. Let us bring our prayers and our worries to Jesus and then let them go. Let's hand them over confidently, knowing we have a Father who loves us. And then let us go out, reach for our sisters' and brothers' hand and walk them to Jesus.
